Rural water supply and sanitation department vijayawada

The Road and Building (R&B) Circle Office in Vijayawada, Andhra Pradesh was established on June 16th, 1999. The office oversees three divisions: Machilipatnam, Vijayawada, and Mylavaram. The circle is responsible for maintaining roads, including patchwork, laying new roads, building bridges and structures, and transferring roads from the Panchayat Raj Department. The jurisdiction of the circle covers an area of 3,449.502 kilometers. The circle has a total of 3499.502 kilometers of roads, with 612.212 kilometers transferred from the Panchayat Raj Department. The roads are categorized into corenet roads (state highways), major district roads, and surface details such as cement roads, block top roads, and WMM/unmetalled roads. The circle has a division-wise breakdown of its roads, with Machilipatnam having 1242.455 kilometers, Vijayawada having 1201.812 kilometers, and Mylavaram having 1055.235 kilometers. The surface details of each division are also listed. The RWS&S Department is responsible for providing drinking water needs to 49 rural mandals with a population of over 2.9 million (according to the 2011 census). The department has 4 revenue divisions, including Machilipatnam, Gudivada, Nuzvid, and Vijayawada, which cover 13 assembly constituencies. The directory is likely used for administrative purposes, such as communication and coordination between departments and with other stakeholders. The Department of Rural Water Supply and Sanitation manages the provision of safe drinking water and sanitation services across rural areas, encompassing 2486 habitations. The government has implemented various initiatives, including hand pumps (11088) and PWS/MPWS/DP Schemes (2320), with CPWS Schemes serving 847 habitations and a population of over 990791. Additionally, there are 389 SS tanks, with varying levels of functionality. Under the SDS-PLAIN grant, 111 works have been sanctioned for minor repairs. The organization chart lists the various officers responsible for different divisions and mandals. The Andhra Pradesh Rural Water Supply Engineers Association is a registered organization that aims to support engineers working in rural water supply. With the reorganization of the department, the association plays a crucial role in ensuring that rural areas have access to safe and reliable water supply systems.
