However, this mode differs from the computer-based and home-based tests in terms of testing methodology. In contrast, the listening test for the OET paper-based involves audio material played through loudspeakers within the testing centers. The English language test for healthcare professionals consists of four subtests, with the Speaking OET subtest conducted via the Zoom app that must be installed on the computer beforehand. A system requirement includes installing ProProctor and the Zoom application, setting the computer screen resolution to maximum, and taking note of the listening section's subdivision into two parts. The reading section is divided into three parts, with a total of 42 questions on generic healthcare topics, taking 60 minutes to complete. Part A includes four short texts for quick reading, followed by follow-up questions within the 15-minute time limit. Part B contains six short passages about the healthcare workplace, requiring careful reading and identification of main ideas. The speaking subtest involves role-playing scenarios based on the healthcare workplace setting, with an interviewer present and three minutes to prepare for each scene. The subtests are scored numerically from 0 to 500 in 10-point increments, corresponding to letter grades ranging from A (450-500) to E (0-90). The OET scoring grade table provides insight into the level of proficiency achieved. The test is available in over 40 countries with 120 locations, conducted 14 times a year at designated testing centers. The computer-based test allows for remote access without visiting test centers. Registration can be done through the official website, making it accessible to healthcare professionals worldwide.
