To merge multiple chapter documents into a single file, use Pages by creating a master document with separate sections for each chapter and copying content from each chapter document to its respective section. Start with a new document, add seven sections, and then open each chapter document in a separate window, selecting and copying content to paste into the corresponding section in the master document. On the first page of each section, insert the desired header or footer with page numbers, which will be incremented for subsequent pages in each section. Alternatively, consider using Scrivener, a paid application available in the Mac App Store, that allows dividing work into separate files and automating the merging process.
