In this case, your medical certificate is valid for 6 months if you're age 40 or older. Good, but you should know that many medical conditions would render you ineligible for a medical certificate. You may appeal the examiner's decision by submitting a request for consideration to the FAA's Aerospace Medical Certification Division. However, it may take days, weeks, or even months if you're applying for special issuance medical certificate. When exercising the privileges of a commercial pilot certificate (flying for compensation or hire), the first-class certificate is the most restrictive. Recreational Pilots. It has the same medical standards required for the first, but with one exception: You're not required to conduct an electrocardiogram. Each class has slightly different requirements.
