You can receive calls from an inmate on a cell phone by registering with one of these companies and setting up a prepaid calling account. Collect phone calls - which automatically charge the person receiving the call - are the default calling option for prisons. Most wireless phone service providers don't accept collect calls, meaning you have to sign up with a third party company to receive calls from jail on your cell phone. When receiving a call, you'll first hear an announcement from an automated operator: "You are receiving a call from [inmate name], an inmate at Monroe County Correctional Center. Press one (1) to accept." If the inmate has no funds in his account, and is calling you for the first time, the call will be free for a brief period of time (often less than a minute). This is to allow the inmate to inform you of where he or she is, and to explain how calls work from this facility. After this short call, the inmate will be placed on hold and you will be presented the opportunity to: Pay (via credit card) to continue the current call. Deposit funds for the inmate to continue your call and, if there is money remaining, the inmate may use the funds to make future calls to any number.
