1. 2 billion dollars worth of deals involving firearms, drugs, counterfeit cash, hacker tools, and hits. Just after Silk Road was shut down, AlphaBay became the major marketplace on the dark web. After its founder, Alexandre Cazes, used the actual email address on the site for communications, reused the same pseudonym on and off the dark web, and kept various unencrypted crypto wallets always open, AlphaBay was shuttered in 2017. A series of security missteps had led them closer to the extent that even when the cops busted into him, he was logged into the site as "admin." Days after the arrest, he was found dead in his cell, allegedly dying by suicide. The dating site Ashley Madison was busted by a hacker group and the impact team in 2015, whereby the hackers threatened to release the user's personal information unless the site and its sister site, Established Men, were closed. Since their deadline wasn't met for the closer of the sites a month later, the Impact team ascended to the dark web, where they started to publish the data. Over 32 million IP addresses of members were released, including that of the site's CEO, with hackers claiming that the site had obliged its primary purpose and that they were forcing members to pay to get their accounts deleted from the site. Everyone loves Google and Bing, but normal search engines only brush the surface of the internet. To dive into the underground internet, you need to use underground search engines. Often, these search engines are tapped into what is currently termed the invisible web, also known as the dark web. It contains information available on the internet that standard search engines don't have access to because they are buried behind query forms or directory requests. The following specialized underground search engines let you access all those hidden areas of the internet, like a legal torrent search engine or public records. Note that none of these can get you in trouble.
1. The Best Torrent Search Engines If you aren't familiar with torrents, it's essentially a shared file that other nodes (computers) on the network can download. People access these networks using torrent clients like BitTorrent or uTorrent. Downloads take place in pieces so that even if you shut down your computer in the middle of a download, you can continue your download later. With that said, finding available torrent files isn't easy. You need a reliable torrent search engine. However, if you use any of the following popular torrent sites, you'll have little trouble finding what you need.
1. The Pirate Bay The Pirate Bay has been a source for searching torrents for a long time. While other torrent search sites have shut down, this one remains. Just remember, if the current URL doesn't work, you'll typically find alternative hosts. You can search for anything from music and TV shows, to games, and applicaions. For listings, you'll see links to launch your torrent client to download.

4. Torrentz2 Torrentz2 has been around since around 2016 and sprung up when the original Torrentz site shut down. While a clone site, it does allow for a quick search with minimal interference to bother with. Upon searching for any common term, you'll typically be greeted by thousands of results. So whether you're looking to find something specific, or you're just looking to browse, you're likely to find what you want here. Search results also show your download size, provide a magnet link, and give the seed to leech numbers.
5. AIO Search AIO Search is another metasearch engine for torrent files. What makes it unique is that you can select specific torrent search engines that you want to include. The list of torrent sites this search engine plugs into is impressive. It is a structure or organization that uses blockchain technology to vote or to predict the outcome of different situations.Darknet/Also known as the dark web, the dark net is a part of the internet not indexed by traditional search engines. Dump/Also referred to as "dumpz," it is an already compiled list of stolen financial information.Escrow/An escrow is a contractual agreement between two parties to allow a third party to hold funds or products till a condition is met.EncryptionThis process converts information or data into a secret code to hide its true meaning. Encrypted information is only understood by someone who has a decryption key.For example, the privacy of dark web users who use Tor browsers is protected because the browser encrypts its user's data.Exit scam/An exit scam is when a dark web marketplace owner runs away with all the money of its investors or buyers. This type of scam is common among cryptocurrency promoters.These promoters usually pull out their funds before or after closing a deal.FE (Finalize Early)/Finalizing early is when a buyer releases their funds before receiving a product. It can also mean paying someone in advance without using an escrow system.Freenet/Freenet is a free peer-to-peer platform to send and receive information over the Internet without being disturbed by censorship. It is also an anonymous platform.Fulz/This is a slang word for full information. It includes personally identifiable information (PII) of a person usually used for theft or fraud by cybercriminals.Ghosting (Gaming)/Ghosting is used when a player cheats in an online game by having certain information about the game or other players. This information usually gives them an advantage in the game.Grams/Grams was a Tor-based dark web marketplace and search engine that allowed users to find illicit products like drugs or weapons. The platform functioned from 2014-2017.Hard Candy/Hard Candy is a dark web page where users can find child pornography.Hidden Wiki/This is a hidden website on the Tor browser that gives dark web users access to hidden links or services within the dark web.Honey Pot/Honey Pot is a trap set by law enforcement agencies to attract hackers or study their hacking methods in order to improve security.HS (Hidden Services)/This is also known as Onion Services/These are pages hosted within the dark web, inaccessible to traditional search engines. This system can be loaded directly from a USB driver and used to access the dark web anonymously.Tor/This is an acronym for The Onion Router.
