It then intersects with several streets in Greenwich Village, including West 10th, 11th, 12th, and 13th Streets. The street is about 40 feet wide, with a mix of one-way eastbound traffic and two curbside lanes. A shorter section between Seventh and Eighth Avenues has westbound traffic and is around 35 feet wide. The part from MacDougal Street to University Place forms the southern border of Washington Square Park and is known as Washington Square South. The street was originally called Asylum Street, named after an orphan asylum that stood there until it was demolished in 1833. It later became West Fourth Street. West Fourth Street intersects with West 12th Street, which runs east-west. The street has a rich history and cultural significance, with the Washington Square Methodist Church standing on the corner of MacDougal Street and Sixth Avenue since 1859-60. The church was known for supporting Vietnam War protesters and activist groups like the Black Panthers and Gay Men's Health Crisis. It was sold in 2005 and parts of it were salvaged to form furniture at a cafe in Brooklyn. Judson Memorial Church, designed by Stanford White and John La Farge, is located on Washington Square South. The West Fourth Street subway station serves as a major transfer point for several subway lines. The street is also home to the famous West Fourth Street Courts, known as "The Cage", where some of New York's best basketball players hang out. The Village has always been a center of bohemian culture, and West Fourth Street has played host to various artistic and intellectual gatherings throughout its history. Washington Square South and its connection to arts, politics, and music, has been a hub for creative expression and cultural significance. The street is home to several notable landmarks including the iconic Gertrude Vanderbilt Whitney's Studio Club, which was established in 1918 as a platform for young artists to showcase their work.
