Oregon, a constituent state of the United States of America, is bounded by Washington to the north, Idaho to the east, Nevada and California to the south, and the Pacific Ocean to the west. The capital, Salem, is situated in the northwestern part of the state. Admitted to the union on February 14, 1859, Oregon comprises a vast area of striking physical diversity, ranging from moist rainforests and fertile valleys in its western third to naturally arid deserts in the east. The state's diverse landscape features numerous natural wonders such as the Columbia River Gorge, Oregon Caves National Monument, Crater Lake National Park, and the majestic snow-covered peaks of the Cascade Range. The name Oregon is believed to be derived from Native American roots. As of 2020, the population stands at approximately 4,237,256, with an estimated 4,272,371 as of 2024. The state's government is led by Governor Tina Kotek and is represented in the U.S. Senate by Ron Wyden and Jeff Merkley. Oregon's nickname is the "Beaver State," while its state flower is the Oregon grape. The forested mountains of western and northeastern Oregon have historically been the core of the state's economy, with many forest-product plants producing a significant portion of the country's softwood lumber and other wood products. The Columbia River system also provides a range of benefits, including electricity generation, water for irrigation and industry, shipping channels, and recreation. In contrast, the heartland of Oregon is the Willamette River valley, which contains major cities such as Portland, Eugene, and Salem, and supports a rich and diversified agriculture. Oregon's landscape can be divided into nine distinct landform regions, with the Coast Range being the lowest in elevation. The Klamath Mountains lie south of the Coast Range and west of the Cascades, featuring ancient resistant rocks and thick forests. Mount Ashland is the tallest peak in Oregon's Klamath Mountains, while the Willamette valley forms an alluvial plain with fertile soils, supporting intensive agriculture. La Grande and Baker valleys, basins of large cattle ranches, are scattered throughout the Blue Mountains. The Willowa Mountains, east of these valleys and near the Idaho border, feature the highest elevations in northeastern Oregon; Rock Creek Butte, with an elevation of 9,105 feet, is located near Baker City. Glaciated mountains display spectacular scenery in this area. To the south lies the High Lava Plains, or High Desert, which is the youngest and least eroded region of landform in Oregon. This region features cinder cones, buttes, and craters; its surface shows signs of immaturity from erosion and localized drainage. The landscape here is arid with skimpy vegetation, making it easy to see surface details. The Columbia Plateau marks the northern boundary of the Great Basin, which borders the High Lava Plains in Oregon. This area features long, narrow fault block ranges that alternate with wide basins. Steens Mountain, a 30-mile-long fault-block range, rises from the desert floor and is 9,773 feet tall. Volcanoes are common in this region, especially in the western part where pumice affects surface runoff, vegetation, and land use. Irrigation agriculture is practiced in some areas, like the Upper Klamath Lake region, while others rely on range livestock. The Malheur-Owyhee Upland in southeastern Oregon is a high plateau with older lava that has been more eroded than the High Lava Plains. The Owyhee River forms notable canyons in the area known as Rimrock Country. In eastern-central Oregon, the Snake River supports productive irrigation agriculture alongside livestock grazing. As of 2015, Oregon had a median household income of \$60,834 and a GDP of \$219.6 billion, ranking it 17th highest in the US. The state's per capita personal income was \$39,848, with an unemployment rate of 5.5% in September 2016. Oregon is known for its diverse landscapes that support various farming types. The Willamette Valley's fertile soil comes from the Missoula Floods, which deposited lake sediment onto the valley floor. In 2016, this region produced over 100 million pounds of blueberries. The state also produces most of its domestic hazelnuts and is a significant wine producer, with many wineries along its coast. Oregon is home to a diverse range of industries, including agriculture, forestry, and manufacturing. The Willamette Valley is known for its peach production, with many farms selling their products directly to consumers. However, foreign land ownership has become an issue in the region, with nearly half of the 1.3 million acres of agricultural land being owned by Canadians. This has led to concerns over the management of these lands and their impact on local economies. ##ARTICLEPrivate employer, including Intel Corporation and Nike Inc., operates large facilities in Hillsboro. These facilities are part of the Silicon Forest ecosystem. The region suffered during the dot-com bust, but companies like Open Source Development Labs continued to grow. This is the only state in the nation with such an excise tax. In terms of health insurance, Cambia Health Solutions dominates the market with a 21% share, followed by Providence Health. Kaiser Permanente leads in the Portland region. Providence and Kaiser are notable for being vertically integrated delivery systems, operating hospitals and offering insurance plans. Other prominent hospital systems in Oregon include Legacy Health, primarily covering Portland, Samaritan Health Services with five hospitals across the state, and Tuality Healthcare in western Portland. In Southern Oregon, Asante operates several hospitals, including Rogue Regional Medical Center. Some hospitals are part of larger multi-state organizations such as PeaceHealth and CommonSpirit Health. On the other hand, Salem Hospital operates independently of these systems. The Oregon Health & Science University is a prominent medical school with two hospitals and clinics in Portland. The state's Medicaid managed care plan, the Oregon Health Plan, is known for its innovations. The Portland area has a well-established healthcare system, with two-thirds of Medicare enrollees participating in Medicare Advantage plans. Oregon is the 27th most populous state in the United States, with a total area of approximately 98,381 square miles (254,806 km2). The state capital is Salem, while Portland is the largest city. Oregon was admitted to the Union as the 33rd state on February 14, 1859. The region's history dates back to the early 19th century, when mountain men discovered a passway over the Rocky Mountains, which became known as the South Pass. This route played a significant role in the Oregon Trail, which brought thousands of pioneers to the west coast. Despite the challenges and hardships faced by these settlers, many successfully made the journey, with some even leaving behind wagon ruts that remain visible today. The pioneers' journey to Oregon was a perilous one. They sought fertile land for farming, hunting for wild game, and fishing in fresh waters. However, finding these resources proved challenging, leading to tensions among the settlers. They often clashed with each other, resorting to fistfights and gunfights. The Trail itself was treacherous, prone to flooding that could sweep away people and belongings. Native American attacks, oxen and horse fatalities, diseases, and injuries further complicated their journey. By 1840, despite these hardships, thousands of Americans had settled in Oregon, establishing towns and farms. The region was part of British North America at the time, but the British presence was minimal, with only a few hundred settlers. This disparity sparked American ambitions to claim the entire territory, fueling their slogan "Fifty-four Forty or Fight!" Many supported James Polk's presidential campaign, believing he shared their views on expanding Oregon's borders. However, after his election, President Polk adopted a more pragmatic approach, opting to negotiate with Britain instead of resorting to war. In 1846, the British proposed dividing the region along the border between the USA and what is now Canada, an offer that President Polk accepted. This compromise secured American control over Oregon, solidifying its status as part of the United States. Oregon, also known as "The Beaver State", is located in the Pacific Northwest United States and shares its northern border with Washington, eastern border with Idaho, southern border with Nevada and California, and western coastline with the Pacific Ocean. In the northwestern part of the state, the capital city of Salem is situated near mountains and forests, where many beavers inhabit their homes. ##ARTICLEThe state of Oregon is characterized by its diverse geography, which includes basins interrupted by isolated mountain ranges. The area is suitable for ranching and farming, with the Cascade Mountains being a prominent feature in northern Oregon. Composed mainly of volcanic rock, this range includes notable peaks such as Mount Hood and Crater Lake. To the west lies the Willamette Lowland, a valley with rich soil that encompasses around 70% of the state's population and features over 19,000 acres of vineyards. The Coast Range, which borders Oregon to the west, is marked by steep cliffs, low mountains, and small lakes. In contrast, the Klamath Mountains in southwestern Oregon showcase a wide range of altitudes, from 600 feet to over 7,400 feet. The state is divided into 36 counties, listed alphabetically. Oregon's geography also features canyons, flat valleys, and rolling hills, with the Willamette River flowing through it. The city of Salem, located in the northwestern part of the state, serves as both the capital and the second-largest city. It has a robust agricultural industry, which earned it the nickname "Cherry City." Meanwhile, Portland, situated at the confluence of the Columbia and Willamette Rivers, is the largest and most populous city. Portland's economy is driven by high-tech industries, agriculture, electronics manufacturing, and healthcare services. The city also functions as a major port, handling trade and distribution for wheat and automobile equipment. As part of the Pacific Northwest region, Oregon shares borders with Washington to the north, Idaho to the east, Nevada to the southeast, California to the south, and the Pacific Ocean to the west.
