Punishment for heresy was torture and death. Galileo has risked life to educate at the church on how they were wrong, but the church saddling point should stay, and Galileo's head was to go. At 68, Galileo could not afford to lose his head in front of the Inquisition for a simple fact. He, therefore, made a public confession that was wrong: A, I kept and believed that the sun is the center of the universe and is immobile, and that the earth is not the center and is mobile; willing, therefore, to remove from the mind of the eminces, and of every Catholic Christian, this suspicion voicily rightly entertained towards me, with a sincere heart and unknown faith, I have to ably, curse, and I hate them aforementioned errors and heresies, and generally Every other error is contrary to the Holy Church; And I swear that it will never be more in the future to say or affirm anything verbally or in writing, which can give rise to a similar suspicion of me; But if he knew any heretic or anyone who is suspected of heresy, who will denounce him to this St. Office, or to the investor or ordinary of the place where I can be; I swear, after all, and I promise that I will realize and observe all the penitences that have been or are laid on me from this holy instance. (Galileo Galilei, Abiuri, 22 June 1633) The quote Above, "Eppur moves!" A, was found in a Spanish painting. Both Galileo in reality said these words are unknown, but it is believed that Galileo murmured these words among the teeth after being forced to retract the opinions of him. The forced abi that Galileo had had Support is one of the most significant events in the history of the world. It shows how free the spirit and scientific thought has always been suffocated by conservative opinions of a few powerful. Humanity will be debt with this scientist without fear. Galileo, which we regal the "father of modern astronomy", the "Father of Modern Physics", and "the father of modern science." The proletarians have nothing to lose that their chains.
