As for "too busy", it must not be a human scan of your e-mails. It is easy to imagine that someone experienced to develop the e-mail client can develop programmatic rules for Sensitive information and forward it to the external storage position and to the man is notified only when enough sensitive information pieces are collected on an individual. The e-mail is involved in many other security activities: * The email is sometimes used as part of the identification verification related to other accounts. * Many email accounts on the record can have a reset link of password email sent to the record email (so whoever has access to the email can reset the password). * Email is also one of the primary means we receive notifications on suspicious activity on credit cards, bank accounts etc. (That could be easily intercepted by someone with access to your email account). When you combine everything above with the possibility of undermining personal information not only from incoming/entry/historical emails, but also from device storage, it seems a bit overwhelming for me. And yes, there are often barriers other than email (SMS notifications, phone notifications), but somehow people still get their hacked accounts and their stolen identity so for my thinking, we should not give up any of these barriers lightly. Are you putting out a good product (even fantastic) enough to make a reliable dev? I think you know the answer if you followed comments on ES File Explorer on that other Android forum. I'm sorry if this goes out overly arguing or fear-eating. I'm just giving my vision of things. I don't claim to be an expert. Also I should clarify that I am only mentioning these things as general principles related to security management / permission because it seemed absent to me initially. I am certainly not having made any judgment on this particular product or must as I did not know anything about them.
