Tell us about it in the comments and we might feature it in a future post.Guy Fieri is taking on Bill Murray today in “The Nacho Average Showdown.” The two men will battle it out to determine who can make the best nachos.The live event is happening at 5pm ET on The Food Network’s Facebook page (direct link here) and will be judged by Shaquille O’Neal and Terry Crews. Fieri and Murray’s sons Hunter Fieri and Homer Murray will also compete against one another.The live event is to raise funds for Fieri’s Restaurant Employee Relief Fund (RELF), which offers financial assistance to employees impacted by the coronavirus shutdown.Andrew Lloyd Webber has been making a new musical available to stream every Friday night for a few weeks now through his “The Shows Must Go On!” YouTube channel.Today, Webber is streaming his most popular musical, “Cats.” The screening is a recording of the full stage show from 1998 (not the recent movie) and stars Elaine Page and Sir John Mills. Page was part of the original cast.Webber will be offering live commentary during the performance for those who want to hear it. Another stream will just show the musical, with no commentary included.Both are available to stream now on “The Shows Must Go On” YouTube page and will remain available until Sunday morning.Queen’s Freddie Mercury died of AIDS in 1991. In April 1992, The Freddie Mercury Tribute Concert for AIDS Awareness took place at Wembley Stadium in front of a crowd of 72,000 people. You can watch the star-studded show yourself at home this weekend. It went live at 2 p.m. EST on Queen’s YouTube page and will remain available until 2 p.m. EST on Sunday.Queen’s remaining members Brian May, Roger Taylor and John Deacon were joined on stage by many of the biggest acts in the world including David Bowie, George Michael, Annie Lennox, Elton John, Guns N’Roses, Robert Plant, Metallica, Liza Minelli, Def Leppard, Seal, Roger Daltry and many more.Tonight Aisha Tyler (“Whose Line Is It Anyway,” “Archer”), Stephen Amell (“Arrow”), Cassandra Jean (“Roswell, New Mexico”—and Stephen’s wife) and another surprise guest will join one another for a live-streamed virtual game night in support of Covid-19 relief. In tonight’s special episode of “Celebrity Jackbox,” a new series from Jackbox Games airing throughout May, Stephen, Aisha and Cassandra will play a number of Jackbox Games from their homes via video conference. The episode celebrates the International Rescue Committee, which aids refugees and people whose lives have been shattered by conflict and disaster. The game nights take place every Friday night, and with each episode Jackbox Games is donating \$100,000 to the featured charity, with a total of \$1,000,000 in donations throughout the series.Jason Isbell and his wife and collaborator Amanda Shires are performing an acoustic show tonight to celebrate the release of their new album “Reunions,” released last Friday, May 8.The show will be broadcast live from Brooklyn Bowl in Nashville starting at 8 p.m. EST. While there won’t be an audience in attendance, the show will be one of the first in the new Brooklyn Bowl—and one of the first concerts to take place in Nashville, period—since the COVID-19 outbreak.The show is happening on the site FANS.com. You’ll need to provide an email address and your zip code in order to watch. If you miss tonight’s show we’ve included a full set from The House of Blues from 2016 above to help you get your fix.Saturday you can catch Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers’ performance from the 2014 LOCKN’ festival. The set featured some of the rock legend’s most recognizable hits, including “Free Fallin’,” “Runnin’ Down a Dream,” “American Girl,” “Refugee,” “Learning to Fly,” “I Won’t Back Down” and “Into the Great Wide Open.”Saturday’s show will be on the site Fans.The stream is helping raise funds for Food Bank NYC and MusiCares.Sam Melo from the band Rainbow Kitten Surprise is hosting a live show from his living room tonight. The solo show kicks off at 8 p.m. EST and is a fundraiser for the Second Harvest Food Bank of Middle Tennessee.You can catch the performance on the band’s YouTube page.If you’re not familiar with the band, that YouTube page has a ton of videos from the band’s previous performances, including almost its entire set (broken up by songs) from Austin City Limits.Video chatting app Houseparty is offering a full lineup of house parties with celebrities through a three-day “In the House” party series.Things officially kick off today at 5 p.m. EST with a party thrown by Zoey Deschanel, during which she’ll be cooking “heavenly bites” and spinning some of her rare record collection. Other party hosts for Friday include Keegan-Michael Key, Tinashe, CHVRCHES, Miguel and Katy Perry. You can check out the full schedule here.You’ll need the free Houseparty app to watch—and whatever you want to watch you’ll need to catch live. There are no replays available via Houseparty; however, it will be rebroadcasting all of this weekend’s parties exactly 24 hours after their original release. Ready for the long weekend? Tonight’s performance is Mozart’s Don Giovanni starring Joan Sutherland, James Morris, and Gabriel Bacquier. It was recorded in March of 1978, which should make it an interesting one to watch.Tonight’s performance is the first of three happening this weekend. Each show goes live on the Met’s website at 7:30 p.m. ET each night and remains available until 6:30 p.m. the following evening.Saturday, May 23 Gounod’s Faust Starring Marina Poplavskaya, Jonas Kaufmann, and René Pape, conducted by Yannick Nézet-Séguin. From December 10, 2011.Sunday, May 24 Massenet’s Manon Starring Anna Netrebko, Piotr Beczala, and Paulo Szot, conducted by Fabio Luisi. From April 7, 2012.The NYC Ballet is continuing its digital spring season today with a recording of the group performing Christopher Wheeldon’s “Liturgy” in April, 2017.The performance features Maria Kowroski and Jared Angle with NYCB Concertmaster Kurt Nikkanen and the New York City Ballet Orchestra conducted by NYCB Music Director Andrew Litton.It will be followed by a performance of Christopher Wheeldon’s Carousel (A Dance), filmed on September 29, 2018. That performance features Lauren Lovette and Tyler Angle with Emilie Gerrity, Peter Walker, Kristen Segin, and Ralph Ippolito with the New York City Ballet Orchestra conducted by NYCB Resident Conductor Daniel Capps.Tonight’s performance kick off at 8 p.m. ET.Cirque du Soleil is offering a new Cirque du Soleil “Behind the Curtain” special this afternoon on the group’s YouTube page.The stream allows the cast and crew of the Cirque show Kurios, offering you an inside look at the show backstage as well as the costumes, makeup, and training that go into a Cirque production.Before COVID-19, Krystal Joy Brown portrayed the role of Eliza in Hamilton. On Sunday, she’ll be performing live from midtown’s Worldwide Plaza in NYC at both 6:15p.m. and 7:15p.m.If you happen to live nearby you can catch the performance from your window. If not, you can join in via Instagram Live.The show is a benefit for the Food Bank of New York City. It was originally scheduled to happen on Friday, but was postponed to Sunday due to weather.Daily YouTube show “Stars in the House” did a reunion show last month with the women involved in the 2000s show “Desperate Housewives” and today it’s catching up with the men from the show.The reunion will include Ricardo Antonio Chavira, Doug Savant, James Denton, Mark Moses, Tuc Watkins and Kevin Rahm.It goes live in the “Stars in the House” YouTube page at 8p.m. ET.And if you want to see the women’s episode, we’ve embedded that below:Defected Records is hosting a digital festival on its YouTube page today featuring some of its artists Djing one-hour sets.
