Other search tools include the Virginia state site and the Bureau of Prisons site To search for an inmate in Henrico County Regional Jail West you can use Pigeonly Prison Locator Service. State prison lookups can vary depending on locale. This is why it is important to use inmate services to make things easy. Incarceration is difficult for families and inmates. Inmates are often to various locations throughout the inmate list for Virginia department of corrections. Families can also search their Inmate by going on Henrico County Regional Jail West website. You will need your inmate ID, which is provided to them when they are assigned a particular facility. All the information related to an inmate gets updated in the list containing their date of release and incarceration. Please note that the database only contains currently incarcerated inmates. Register with Pigeonly for additional help.How to find someone in Henrico County Regional Jail West : STEP 1: Go to pigeonly.com to start a search for your inmate. First, click "Get Started" and enter your inmate's first and last name. STEP 2: Make sure to check if your inmate's facility is county, state, or federal.STEP 3: Find your inmate and select from the list of services designed to help you keep in touch.STEP 4: Finally, you'll need to register an account with Pigeonly, and we'll provide you with your loved one's contact information. (Don't worry, registration is completely free!) Before we begin discussing the various tools to help you locate your loved one, let's quickly clarify that you'll need to have some vital identifying information on hand to do so. This information includes:Your loved one's full legal name (first, middle, and last).Their date of birth.The state in which they're being held.Note that some tools may suggest or require additional information from you about your loved one, depending on individual circumstances. As we go through this list, we'll cover what this information is and where it's applicable. Now, for the inmate location tools. The Bureau of Prisons allows you to search its database of federal prisoners to locate your loved one and uncover their contact information. Note that this database includes only inmates held in federal prisons - we'll get to smaller prisons and jails in a moment. The BOP's database also provides information regarding inmates who have been released, dating back to 1982. When using the BOP's search tool, you can search for a prisoner by name or by a variety of identification numbers. First, let's search for an inmate using their name: Again, searching for a common name without any additional information leads to numerous search results. Also, note that the search engine limits the number of results to 100 - meaning many other inmates with the name John Smith didn't even show up. You can also narrow down your search by including your loved one's race, age, and sex. As this search tool doesn't offer any advanced search features, you may need to include this information to see fewer than 100 results. You can also search for a federal inmate using several different identification numbers, such as: BOP Register Number DCDC NumberFBI Number INS Number These identification numbers belong solely to your loved one so using this method is the best way to generate accurate results from the BOP's site. The BOP's search tool only shows results for federal inmates. To find an inmate who is held in a local jail or a Virginia state prison, you will need the Virginia state website or the Henrico County Regional Jail West site. Many facilities require the use of an inmate ID number. Check with the Henrico County Regional Jail West to find out what other information you may use on their website to locate your loved one. Search for an offender's location and release date if they are incarcerated and under the custody of the Virginia Department of Corrections (VADOC). Offenders who are not under VADOC custody will not appear in the search results. For all searches, you will be required to enter: At least the first letter of the offender's first name AND their full last nameOR The offender's seven-digit Offender ID # According to the Virginia Freedom of Information Act, Henrico County public records are all documents that are generated or received by a public body in connection with a public activity. The form of the records is immaterial, as public records may be either physical documents or electronic documents. They include documents that are created through handwriting, photography, photostating, typewriting, electronic recording, or other forms. However, the following information are exempted from public access:Court documents and reports that should be kept confidentialHealth recordsRecords of ongoing investigationsInformation that is protected by attorney-client privilegesFinancial information, trade secrets, proprietary information, and confidential informationInformation concerning security plans of school safety auditsRecords of lawful closed meetings, or records compiled for use in litigation or administrative investigationPersonnel information of individuals that can be identifiedComputer software developed by or for a state agency, public institution of higher education in the Commonwealth, or political subdivision of the Commonwealth.Appraisals and cost estimates of real property subject to a proposed purchase, sale, or lease, prior to the completion of such purchase, sale, or lease.Henrico County Crime StatisticsThe Virginia State Police serves as the primary repository for crime statistics in the State. The office publishes these statistics every year. In 2019, there were 452 reported violent crimes and 8,050 reported property crimes in Henrico County. The violent crimes included seven homicides, 34 rapes, 120 robberies, and 291 aggravated assaults. The property crimes included 569 burglaries, 6,949 larcenies, 515 motor vehicle thefts, and 17 arsons.Between 2018 and 2019, there was an increase in the crimes by 3%. Compared to the 2018 statistics, there was a decline in homicide (46%), aggravated assault (17%), burglary (15%), motor vehicle theft (10%), and arson (41%). There was an increase in rape (3%), robbery (3%), and larceny (7%).Are Henrico County Criminal Records Public?Henrico County criminal records are generally public, as required by Virginia State Law. However, criminal records of juveniles are not public. The Virginia State Police carries out criminal record checks for interested persons. Eligible parties can obtain either name-based checks or fingerprint checks. The name-based checks only show convictions, while the fingerprint checks also show arrest records. Anyone can obtain their name-based record check by completing and notarizing the Criminal History Search Form (SP-167). Law enforcement agencies and some employers may request name-based checks by completing the Criminal Record Name Search Form (SP-230). There is no need to notarize the form. For fingerprint checks, requesters should submit a fingerprint card with the request form.Each copy of the Henrico criminal records costs \$15 to obtain. There is an additional \$5 charge if the requester is also checking sex offender information. Henrico arrest records are only available online for the first 30 days after the arrest. Interested persons can conduct searches of these records. Users can either use the quick date search or the advanced features search. The advanced features search will allow searches by date range and the specific crime or crime category. Incident crime reports are also available online. Interested persons can search online for reports of criminal incidents. Users can either use the quick date search or the advanced search. The advanced search includes searches by date range, crime category, location, and other options.Henrico County arrest records and police reports are also available at the Henrico County Police Division. Henrico residents can find information on sex offenders living or working in Henrico. The information provided would include the sex offender's picture, name, address, and other relevant information. Persons using the online registry can search for offenders by city, county, school, address, and name. Users can also optionally add additional search parameters for more specific results. Virginia State Police also provides email notifications to alert residents that sign up when a sex offender moves to an area.How to Find Henrico County Inmate Records?The Henrico County Sheriff's Office maintains records of inmates in the Henrico County Regional Jail West and Jail East. The Sheriff's Office manages both jails and provides county jail inmate information online. Interested persons can search for inmates in any of the jails either by their last name or by selecting the starting letter of the inmate's last name. The visitor would need to complete and submit the Jail West Visitation Form or the Jail East Visitation Form, depending on the inmate's location.Court RecordsHenrico court records are the documents containing information of cases heard by courts in the County. Henrico County is home to a Circuit Court, County General District Court, and a Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court. The Circuit Court presides over civil and criminal cases beyond the jurisdiction of other courts, and generally has jurisdiction in all civil and criminal cases. The Juvenile and Domestic Relations District Court and the General District Court have jurisdiction over certain types of criminal and civil cases. However, cases are exempted from being available to the public if a court makes an order for that purpose. The Office of the Clerk of the Henrico Circuit Court maintains court records and makes these records available to interested persons. The person who seeks to obtain the records may need to pay applicable fees, provide a valid ID, and complete request forms.Can you look up a Henrico County Court Case Online?The Office of the Executive Secretary (OES) of the Supreme Court of Virginia maintains an online case information system. The case information system contains records of Henrico District and Circuit court records. The records available are limited to criminal and traffic cases. There are also online databases for Henrico County Circuit Court and General District Court. Users can search for both criminal and civil court records. The search parameters include case numbers, hearing dates, and names. The records available online are not to serve as official court records.How to Obtain Henrico County Civil Court Case Records?The Circuit Court Clerk's Office maintains Henrico County civil court records. To obtain court records online, users will need to search using the names of the parties, case numbers, and other identifying information.What are Henrico County Vital Records?Henrico County vital records are documents that contain certain life events that occur within Henrico, such as births, deaths, marriages, and divorce. The Henrico Health Department maintains Henrico vital records. The Office of Vital Records of the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) also maintains vital records for all of Virginia, including Henrico County. In accordance with Virginia State Law, vital records are generally not available to all members of the public. Only qualified persons can make successful requests for these records. The qualified persons include the registrant, the registrant's close relatives, and a legal representative of the registrant. However, the records will become publicly accessible after 25 years.Where and How to Obtain Henrico County Divorce Records?The Henrico Health Department maintains Henrico County divorce records. Interested persons can request Henrico divorce certificates. Each copy of a record costs \$12. Only qualified persons such as the parties to the marriage and the immediate family of the parties can obtain copies of the records. The requester would need to provide a valid ID. Persons can make requests to obtain copies of the records. This would involve printing, completing, and signing the Application for Certification of a Divorce Record (available in Spanish). Requesters can also create the application form online or write the request. Requesters will also need to provide a valid identification and payment. The payment should be made either by check or by money order made payable to the State Department of Health. The State Department of Health takes three weeks to process the request. While the request is pending, requesters can track the status of the requests with the application numbers they are issued.Interested persons can also make requests for divorce records from the Vital Records Office online. This can be done by completing the Online Application for Certification of a Vital Record and following the instructions provided.Where and How to Get Public Henrico County Marriage Records?The Henrico Health Department maintains Henrico County marriage records. It costs \$12 per copy to obtain. The records can only be obtained by qualified persons such as the parties to the marriage and their immediate family members. The requester will be required to provide a valid ID. Payments can be made by cash, check, money orders, VISA or Mastercard. Interested persons can make requests for copies of the records in person or by mail. Certified copies cost \$2.50 each to obtain for both in-person requests and mail requests. Mail requests should be accompanied by a self-addressed stamped envelope. If this is not included, it would attract an additional 50 cents and make the total charge \$3. Payment can be made by cash, check, or money order made payable to the Circuit Court Clerk. The Clerk's Office is required to obtain the written permission of one of the parties to the marriage if the marriage license was issued before 1 July 1997 or after 30 June 2001.The Virginia Department of Health Office of Vital Statistics also provides public access to Henrico Marriage records. Interested persons can obtain copies of the records by completing the Application for Certification of a Marriage Record (available in Spanish). Each certified copy costs \$12. The record search also costs \$12. Payments should be made by check or money order made payable to the State Department of Health. The Virginia Department of Health may take up to three weeks to process a request. Box 1000Richmond, VA 23218-1000Phone: (804) 662-6200Where and How to Find Henrico County Birth Records?Henrico County birth records are available at both the Virginia Department of Health Vital Records Office and the Henrico Health Department. The charge is \$12 for each copy of a record from either custodian. The Henrico Health Department only issues Henrico County birth certificates to immediate family members of the registrant, such as the registrant's mother, father, husband, wife, child, brother, sister and grandparents. A legal guardian with proof of custody papers can also make requests for copies of a record. The requester should provide a valid ID. Interested persons can obtain Henrico death certificates from the health department. The certificates are ready thirty days after the death and the records include all the deaths that occur in the State of Virginia. There is a fee of \$12 for each requested copy of a record. The payment can be made cash, check, money order, or card (VISA or Mastercard). Only eligible persons can receive copies of a record. The requester will need to provide a valid ID.
